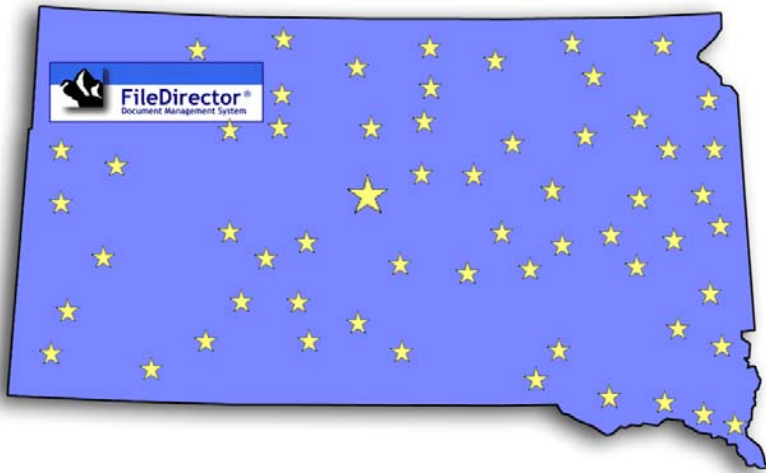




Department of Social Services Adds 41 Sites State of South Dakota Expands File Director® Utilization
